The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, & 24, established on former survey*, which is a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 4" sq., 24" in the ground, for ¼ secs. cor. mkd: T19S S13 on NE, R10W S24 on SE, S23 on SW and S14 on NW faces, faces with 3 notches on S & 1 notch on E edges; from which

 A Fir, 7" dia. bears N.16°E. 25 lks. mkd: T19S R10W S13 BT

 A Fir, 8" dia., bears S.12½°E., 31 lks., mkd: T19S R10W S24 BT.

 A Fir, 6" dia. bears S.36°W. 11 lks. mkd: T19S R10W S23 BT

 A Fir, 5" dia. bears N.9°W. 10 lks., mkd: T19S R10W S14 BT

* 1899 survey is a corrective resurvey of Chandler's 1895 survey. The Orig. 1895 survey was not accepted but some corners were accepted on a case by case basis. Per Eugene's & Coos Bay's BLM offices.
