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GLO survey by Wm. P. Wright, Deputy Surveyor, under contract #486, dated Aug. 1, 1883 - (DCSO records Vol. 2 Page(s) 480)

Set post, 4" dia., 4 ft. long, with marked stone, 12" in ground, raised mound of stone alongside. No witness trees.

BLM dependent resurvey by Thomas A Tillman, Raymond M. Bicknell, Han W. Thielsen & Joseph S. Gawron, Cadastral Engineers, under Group No. 305 surveyed Aug. 1953 thru Sept. 1954 - (DCSO recs. Vol. 29 Page(s) 12370)

Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 10 & 15, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the orig. corner. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1" dia., 28" in the ground with brass cap marked:

S 15
1954

from which

- A cedar, 60" dia., bears N.57°E., 36 lks., mkd: 1/4 S10 BT.
- A cedar, 55" dia., bears S.22°W., 71 lks., mkd: 1/4 S15 BT.

BLM remonumentation of Orig. corner points by Wm. W. Glenn, C. Albert White, & James E. Jelley, Cadastral Surveyors, under Group #s 350 & 635, surveyed April & May 1967 (DCSO records Vol. 43 Page(s) 16736-7)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 10 & 15, monumented with an iron post, 1" dia., firmly set, level with the surface of the ground with brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which BTs mkd. in 1954

- A cedar, 60" dia. bears N.57°E., 36 lks. with scribe marks 1/4 S10 B visible on open blaze. Rescribe BT on new blaze
- A cedar, 57" dia. bears S.22°W., 71 lks, with scribe marks 1/4 S T visible on open and burned blaze. Rescribed 1/4 S15 BT on new blaze.

Set a 6 ft. steel fence post alongside the iron post.

Found - 1954 GLO brass cap set firmly in the ground.
60" downed Cedar, S.22°W., 47.0' (scar vis.) Rec. S.22°W., 46.9' (1954 BT)
66" Cedar N.56°E., 24.6' (scar vis.) Rec. N.57°E., 23.8' (1954 BT)
New BT - 14" Fir, S.23°E., 35.2' scribed & painted red.
Note - Corner lies on NW slope about 30' East on North Sister Creek.
