left for scribing or scars.
Iron pipe (also old Cedar stake alongside) is in 3-
way fence corner, fences E., W., and S.

Found - A 2½" dia., brass cap (properly mkd) on a 1" I.D. iron pipe protruding 12" above ground. 1928
1" I.D. iron pipe with alum. sleeve (origin unknown) is loosely set protruding 12" above ground N.45°W., 1.0 ft. from above fd monument. 1964
A cedar 15" dia., now a maximum 30" dia., approx. 3 ft. tall cedar stump with most of westside missing; bears S.76°E., 13.0 ft. (rec. S.73°E., 14.5 ft.) OBT
No evidence of NE OBT remains.
9" I.Cedar now a 30" dia., 3 ft. tall I.Cedar stump with no blaze evident. This stump is opened enough to show a sound face and the scribing "S". This stump bears N.44¾°W. 71.0 ft (rec. N.45½°W., 71.0 ft.) 1964
10" I.Cedar now a 12" dia., 1 ft. tall rotted I.Cedar stump with a rotted away blaze bears S.64°W., 29.0 ft. (as per record) 1964
Fences called out in 1968 renewal are down, some evidence of E-W fence remains, south running fence is gone.
Renewed- The 1" I.D. iron pipe with an alum. sleeve is removed from ground (fd. to measure 39" long) and is reset on north edge of fd. BC monument protruding 11" above ground.
A 9" dia., D.Fir scribed "NNW DLC 37 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears N.40½°E., 36.9 ft.
A 13" dia., I.Cedar scribed "NNW DLC 37 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears S.68¾°E., 37.9 ft.
A 10" dia., W.Oak scribed "NNW DLC 37 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears S.45½°W., 7.9 ft.
A 19" dia., D.Fir scribed "NNW DLC 37 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears N.1°W., 2.7 ft.
Note - Corner is on mild east slope in mixed age reprod D.Fir forest.
Compass decl. 15½°E.
