A power-pole "7-131" now a sawn off base of a power pole 12" in dia., & 3 ft. tall (labeled portion of upper power pole lies loose on ground downhill from fd. base. Sawn base of power pole bears S.45°E., 10.5 ft. (as per rec.) 1964

Old fences no longer evident near corner.

New - A double trunk W.Oak: The northerly trunk is 9" in dia., and grows horizontally from the root crown. The southerly trunk is 5" in dia., growing perpendicular from root crown and is scribed "X CS" "BT" on a high-low blaze. The center of the root-crown of this tree bears N.13°E., 18.0 ft.

A pistol-butt 5" dia., W.Oak scribed "X" "CS BT" on a high-low blaze; bears N.79½°W., 14.6 ft.

No other suitable trees in area.

Note - Monument is on moderately steep SE slope in mixed woods of maple, oak & fir.

Compass decl. 15½°E.
