Found - A 1" I.D. alum. pipe, set plumb protruding 1 ft.
above ground. (1962)
The 3/4" iron peg (fd in 1962 but of unknown origin)
is set inside of, and with its top 9" lower than,
the aluminum pipe monument.
A fir 36" dia., now a very rotted 48" dia., 3 ft.
tall D.Fir stump with no face or scribing
evidence fd; bears N.30°E., 23.8 ft. OBT
An 11" D.Fir now a very rotted 20" dia., 5 1/2 ft. tall
D.Fir stump with the area of the blaze and
scribing now rotted away; bears S.43 3/4°W., 50.5
ft. (Rec. S.45°W., 50.5 ft.) 1962

New - A 12" D.Fir now a 25" dia., 5 ft. tall D.fir stump showing a fully healed double blaze (rotted behind bark, no face or scribing evidence seen); bears N.72°E., 38.2 ft. (1962 distance would be a face measurement, bearing agrees with record)

A 5" dia., D.Fir scribed "X" "CSBT" on a high and low blaze; bears N.23½°E., 4.4 ft.

A 7" dia., D.Fir scribed "¼ S19 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears S.8°E., 8.3 ft.

An 8" dia. D.Fir scribed "¼ S19 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears S.63¼°W., 13.4 ft.

A 7" dia., D.Fir scribed "¼ S18 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears N.16°W., 10.7 ft.

A green & white painted steel fence post is SW'ly 0.5 ft. from the alum. pipe monument and protrudes 3½ ft. above ground.

Note - Monument is on moderate East slope forested with young D.Fir reprod and some maple.
Compass decl. 15½°E.
