Corner lies in the approx. location of old fence corner, now almost destroyed with only a few post remaining.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 6 & 7, monumented with an iron post, 1½" dia., firmly set projecting 10" above ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd. from which new bearing trees
A fir, 24" dia., bears S.76½°E., 46.3 ft., mkd. ¼ S7 BT.
A fir, 5" dia., bears N.32°W., 11.5 ft., mkd. ¼ S6 BT.
Search was made for the bearing trees reported by Peterson and Berry in 1971-72, none of which were recovered.
New BTs has a 2½"x¼" magnetic nail driven at the base on right side center & has a magnet deposited in a white plastic case at the base of the stainless steel post. Alum angle irons were driven alongside each monument.
