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Found - Orig. 20" Fir, now 28" stump, S.17°E., 18.5 ft., shows good bark scribe "S". (BLM opened the base of this stump to a face, no scribing visible.)  
Orig. 8" Hemlock, now partly rotted stump, N.17°W., 23.1 ft., chopped out piece from inside showing good scribing "¼".

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The ¼ sec. cor., remonumented by Rogers in 1965, with an iron post, 1" dia., firmly set, projecting 8" above ground, with brass cap mkd. in 1965, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A sawed Hemlock stump 25" dia., bears N.17°W., 35 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A sawed Fir stump 30" dia., bears S.17°E., 28 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Rogers:

A Fir 6" dia., bears N.47°W., 31 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S32 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

A Cedar snag 13" dia., bears S.21½°W., 30 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S5 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

and a new bearing tree:

A Fir 5" dia., bears S.39°W., 8 lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S5 BT.  
Add marks BLM 1967 to brass cap.
