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Set  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. post, from which

A R.Fir 30" dia., bears N.10 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 46 lks. dist.

A R.Fir 15" dia., bears S.59 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 23 lks. dist.

BLM Resurvey by Floyd A. Brooks and Timothy A. Kent, Cadastral Surveyors, under Group #648, Surveyed Aug. 1967/Sept. 1971 - (DCSO records Vol. 37 Page(s) 15261-62)  
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The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing tree:

A Fir 57" dia., bears N.10 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 46 lks. dist., with scribe marks  $\frac{1}{4}$  S visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron pipe 14" long, 1" dia., 14" in the ground. This point is located at the top of a road cuy where it is impracticable to set a standard iron post.

From which new bearing trees and reference monuments:

A Fir 10" dia., bears N.79°E., 182 lks. dist. mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S33 BT.

A Fir 5" dia., bears S.7  $\frac{3}{4}$ °W., 100 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S4 BT.

An Iron post 28" long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " dia., set 20" in the ground, for a reference monument, bears South 25 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. " $\frac{1}{4}$  S4 RM 1967", and an arrow pointing to the corner.

An Iron post 28" long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " dia., set 24" in the ground, for a reference monument, bears S.62°W., 30 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. " $\frac{1}{4}$  S4 RM 1967", and an arrow pointing to the corner.

Corner is located on the top of the cut bank on the S. side of a logging road, 30 lks. wide, bears NE. and NW. in a curve.
