Dogwood, 6" dia., bears S.78°E., 56 lks., mkd: ¼ S BT.</p>

Face is 24" in from outside of tree with no scribing visible. A bark scribed "BT" is visible above blaze. This tree bears S.52°W., 48.8 ft. Orig. Dogwood is completely gone. (not fd.) 15" Fir (Orig. 9") bears S.7°E., 65.4 ft. with well healed double blaze. 26" Fir (Orig. 20") with well healed double blaze (¼S scribed in bark above blaze) bears S.78°W., 53.2 ft. (rec. S.75°W., 51.1 ft.)</p> <p>Set - Brass cap protruding 10" above ground, stamped "DOUGLAS CO SURVEYOR 1981 T21S ¼ S19 S20 R6W" (T iron was reset alongside BC)</p> <p>New BT - 6" Fir bears N.13°E., 18.7 ft. scribed "¼ S20 CS BT" in double blaze. DCSO BT tags put on all trees.</p>
