Set post 4" dia., 4 ft. long with marked stone 12" in ground for 1/4 sec. cor. marked 1/4 on W face from which:

- Laurel, 6" dia., bears N.47°W., 47 lks., mkd: 1/4 S BT.
- Fir, 6" dia., bears N.65°E., 20 lks., mkd: 1/4 S BT.

BLM dependent resurvey by Marvin J. Lytle, Palmer Norseth, Thomas A. Tillman, Raymond M. Bicknell, Joseph S. Gawron, and Hans W. Thielsen, Cadastral Engineers, under Group #304, Surveyed Aug. 1952 thru Oct. 1954 - (DCSO recs. Vol. 30 Page(s) 12567)

Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 1 & 2, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the orig. corner. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1" dia., 28" in the ground with brass cap marked:

- A Fir, 8" dia., bears S.8°E., 14 lks., mkd: 1/4 S1 BT.
- A Fir, 20" dia., bears S.81°W., 20 lks., mkd: 1/4 S2 BT.

Fd. Ok on BLM remonumentation of certain orig. corner points by Wm. W. Glenn & James E. Jelley, Cadastral Surveyors, under group #s 350 & 635, surveyed April/May 1967 - (DCSO records C.S. File 65/27-1) \*\* also set a 6 ft. steel fence post alongside the iron post.\*\*

BLM dependent resurvey by Joel E. Robb, Cadastral Surveyor, under Group # 1171, surveyed Aug./Sept.. 1983 - (DCSO records Vol. 46 Page(s) 17803-4)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 1 & 2, monumented with an iron post, 1" dia., firmly set, projecting 10" above ground, alongside of which is a steel fence post, loosely set, projecting 5 ft. above ground, with brass cap properly mkd., from which the remains of a BT mkd. by Lytle, Norseth, Tillman, Bicknell, Gawron, & Thielsen:

- A Fir snag, 9" dia., bears S.12°E., 14 lks., with healed blaze. (Rec. S.8°E,)

and new BTs

- A Fir, 4" dia., bears S.82°E., 17 1/2 lks., mkd: X BT.
- A Fir, 5" dia., bears S.45°W., 24 lks., mkd: 1/4 S2 BT.
