36" Fir bears N.77°E., (?) lks., blazed in bark and marked ¼S 30 CS BT. (This tree may be an old BT.)

Found - 2½" dia. brass cap on a 1¼" O.D. I.P. firmly set and protruding 6" above ground.
A 6"x16"x10" sandstone loose on ground surface with the marks "¼" on the bottom side bears N.8°E., 1.5 ft. from the I.P. and BC monument (first noted in 1939, origin unknown)
Orig. BT, 10" Fir now a 40" DBH D.Fir with the bark scribing "¼ S31 CS" and an opened blaze with orig. scribing "¼ S" visible, bears S.60°E., 17.8 ft.

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Orig. NE BT gone.
A 36" Fir now a 43" dia. 4 ft. high Fir stump with no scribing remaining bears N.77°E., 58.7 ft.
9" Fir now a 15" DBH D.Fir with a fully healed single blaze bears N.62°W., 7.6 ft.
16" W.Fir now a 20" DBH W.Fir with a fully healed double blaze bears S.52°W., 16.2 ft.
No new monument or bearing trees established. Trees and stump tagged to reflect new record bearings and distances of the renewal. Monument is on wide bench of East slope of ridge approx. 400 ft. above and 900 ft. West of Elk Creek.
