| <p>O.F. Thiel - For:J.B. Powrie - May 18, 1913 - C.S. File 64/48 Page 13</p> <p>-----</p> <p>At the NW cor. of Stillwell Don. claim, Set a Cedar post. Found marks on SW BT, other tree gone. Marked - 10" Fir S.54½°E., 57 lks. 18" Fir S.82°E., 82 lks.</p> |
| <p>Ben B. Irving, D.C.S. - Wit: R.L. Irving; Jess Widdy - April 1928 - C.S. File 2/49</p> <p>-----</p> <p>I identified this location from an original BT bearing proper scribe marks. This is a 50" Fir which I chopped down to find the scribe marks. I set a 3/4" x 36" Pipe, 34" in ground for corner, N.80°E., 26 lks. from the orig. BT. Scribed -14" Fir S.80°W., 73 lks. "T22S R6W Cl. 45 CS BT" as a new BT. Also remarked a 14" Fir, S.84°E., 82 lks. "CS". This tree had been scribed about 30 years ago by someone but not recorded. (See above Thiel visit)</p> |

File 66/32-2</p> <p>-----</p> <p>Found - 1928 3/4" I.D. iron pipe, protrudes 3" out of ground 6" now badly rotted 1½ ft. high D.Fir stump with old axe marks and a burnt blaze, no scribing visible, bears S.86°W. 17.2 ft. (Rec. S.80°W. 17.2 ft) OBT 14" now 24" dia., 6 ft. high D.Fir stump with a fully healed double blaze, bears S.84°W., 48.2 ft. (Rec. S.80°W., 48.2 ft.) 1928 No other BTs found.</p> <p>New - 4" dia., D.Fir double blazed & scribed "X CS BT" bears S.86°W., 22.5 ft. 4" dia., D.Fir double blazed & scribed "X CS BT" bears N.53½°E., 14.7 ft. 4" dia., D.Fir double blazed & scribed "X CS BT" bears S.24°E., 7.5 ft. Compass Decl. 17½°E.</p> |
