Found - A 2½" dia., brass cap (properly marked) on a 1½" O.D. galvanized iron pipe firmly set and protruding 6" above ground. 1961 DCSO

A cedar 12" dia., now a 4 ft. tall approx. 20" dia., rotted cedar stump with no remaining evidence of blaze or scribing; bears South, 4.0 ft. (as per rec) Orig

A fir 36" dia., now a very rotted 4 ft. tall one 48" dia., fir stump with no evidence of blaze or face remaining; bears N.2½°E., 53.0 ft. (rec. North bearing hits west edge of stump, record 51.5 ft. Distance is good orig. face measurement. Orig.

A 12" maple now a double trunk maple the main trunk of which is 22" D.B.H. and shows no good blaze evidence; bears S.68½°W., 44.5 ft. (Rec. S.70°W., 44.5 ft.) 1961

New - An 8" DBH D.Fir scribed "¼ S26 CS BT" on a double blazed; bears N.49½°E., 49.7 ft.

A 15" DBH Maple scribed "¼ S26 CS BT" on a double blaze; bears N.19°W., 54.0 ft.

Note - Monument is in shallow forested creek bottom, north of a spur road and westerly of a BLM Rd. Dec.16°
