8" now 19" Ash bears N.34°E., 12.4 ft. with a healed upper blaze, lower blaze rotted out.
15" Myrtle bears S.6°E., 31.1 ft. with a well healed blaze.

Set gun barrel at corner, 2.5 ft. below ground, with a 3" x 22" x 10" concrete alongside.

Set a WITNESS CORNER 50.0 ft. due East, a 1" x 36" I.P. with a brass cap set 6" above ground mkd: Douglas County Surveyor

A 10" Maple bears S.8°E., 11.4 ft. double blazed and marked "WC NW DLC 50 CS BT"

Corner is on bank of Umpqua River across from Mather mailbox 357, Hwy. 38.

Douglas County Surveyors Office - Randall Smith & Stephen Flause - May 17, 1997 - C.S. 64/74-33

Mon. Fd.- 2½" dia. Brass cap on a 1½" O.D. iron pipe protrudes 3" above ground. (1978)
Dug 3' into sand checked w/ metal detector to locate gun barrel or concrete block.

Accessories Fd.-

From corner position BT's are found as noted in 1978 renewal and a clump of broken myrtle's, largest being 14" dia. no blazes visible, clump fits position of NW myrtle BT's marked in 1916 and 1962.

From wit. corner position (BC/IP)

8" now 19" Ash marked in 1920, with a healed upper blaze and previously opened rotted lower blaze facing true corner position, bears N.76°W., 43.2' (agrees with rec.) 1920.

15" now 20" dia. Myrtle, marked for true corner position in 1962 no blaze visible, bears S.57°W., 52.9' to center of root crown (agrees with rec.) 1962.
