

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION NW Cor. John Gardner DLC #51

| Alias | Description |
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Dependent resurvey by Edith M Forkner, Cadastral Surveyor, under Group #2180 & 2300, surveyed May/Oct. 2007 (DCSO records Vol. 56 Page(s) 22234-5)

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The NW. cor. of DLC 51, in sec. 17, perpetuated by Frear in 1917, and remonumented by Brooks and Jelley in 1963-65; monumented with an iron post, 2½" dia., firmly set, projecting 8" above ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd. from which the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Frear and reported by Brooks and Jelley

A roothole bears N.46½°E., 33.3 ft., alongside of which is a down fir, 35" dia., no marks visible.

A decayed fir stump, 24" dia., bears S.42½°E., 21.1 ft., with a healed blaze.

and the remains of the BTs mkd. by Brooks and Jelley

A roothole bears S.51°E., 38.3 ft., alongside of which is a down decayed double cascara, 24" dia., with a healed blaze.

A fir, 45" dia., bears N.59°W., 31.7 ft., with a healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A W.Fir, 42" dia., bears S.80°E., 41.3 ft., mkd. X at breast height BT.

Corner is located on an E. slope.

From this corner, S.8°37'39"W., on the W. bdy. of Claim No. 51, at 633.17 ft., to a point, from which a point established by Haines, in 1966, and was not accepted for control in this survey, bears N.81°22'21"W., 5.39 ft.; monumented with a T-iron, firmly set, projecting 6" above ground. Point is located on an E. slope.
