Point for the 1/4 sec. cor., at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
Set an iron post, 28" long, 2 1/2" dia., 24" in the ground, with brass cap mkd:

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, reestablished by Brooks and Jelley in 1963-65; monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2" dia., firmly set, projecting 2" above ground, with a brass cap (properly) mkd.

A fir snag, 42" dia., bears S.20°E., 22.4 ft., with illegible scribe marks visible.

and bearing trees mkd. by Minor in 1994

A fir, 13" dia., bears N.73°E., 8.5 ft., with a healed blaze.

A fir, 22" dia., bears S.55°W., 20.6 ft., with a healed blaze.
