The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 8 & 17, reestablished by Brooks and Jelley in 1963-65; monumented with an iron post, 2½" dia., loosely set, projecting 16" above ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Brooks and Jelley

A decayed fir stump, 47" dia., bears N.62°E., 73.9 ft., with a healed blaze.

A maple, 40" dia., with several sprouts beginning from a burl, bears S.48½°E., 24.4 ft., with scribe marks S17 visible on partially healed decayed blaze fallen off the tree.

A W.Fir, 11" dia., bears N.78¼°W., 15.1 ft., mkd. ¼ S8 BT.

Add collar of stone to the cor. to stabilize the monument.

Corner is located on a steep N. slope, W., 60 ft. from a drainage, course N.45°W., and W., 510 ft. of a ridge, extending N.40°E. and S.20°W.
