A Fir 24" dia., bears N.66°E., 79 lks. dist.
A Fir 14" dia., bears S.45°E., 51 lks. dist.
A Fir 20" dia., bears S.66°W., 131 lks. dist.
A Fir 24" dia., bears N.83°W., 127 lks. dist.

BLM resurvey by Floyd A. Brooks and James E. Jelley, Cadastral Surveyors, under Group #'s 514 and 350, surveyed June 1963/March 1965 (DCSO records Vol. 33 Page(s) 13698)

The Sec. cor., determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing trees:

A sawed and rotted Fir stump 52" dia., bears N.66°E., 79 lks. dist. with remnants of healed blaze visible.
A sawed and rotted Fir stump 48" dia., bears S.66°W., 131 lks. w/scribe marks T S8 R W T visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28" long, 2½" dia., 21" in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 2½ ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd:

20" now 30" dia. 2½' high D.Fir stump, with a rotted blaze, no scribing visible, bears S.66°W., 86.5' (agrees with rec.) OBT continued next page

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10" dia. dead Fir now 15" dia. alive W.Fir, with a partially healed rotted blaze scribed "T" found, bears N.75°W., 56.1' (agrees with rec.) 1963

The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, & 9, perpetuated by Brooks and Jelley in 1963-65; monumented with an iron post, 2½" dia., firmly set, projecting 8" above ground, in a collar of stone, with brass cap (properly) mkd.
from which the remains of an original bearing tree
A decayed fir stump, 48" dia., bears S.66°W., 86.5 ft., no marks visible. Stump is behind a white fir, 6" dia., 60 ft. from the cor.
and a bearing tree mkd. by Brooks and Jelley
A hollow fir, 17" dia., bears N.75°W., 56.1 ft., with reverse scribe marks T visible inside the hollow.
(Record, dead.) Tree has a broken top and has grown a new one.
and the remains of the BTs mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office in 1997
A W.Fir, 18" dia., bears N.2½°E., 48.0 ft., with a healed double blaze.
An alder, 13" dia., bears S.62¼°E., 28.5 ft., with scribe marks 22S R8W S9 CS and other illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed double blaze.
A fir, 15" dia., bears S.49°W., 54.0 ft., with a healed double blaze.
A maple, 14" dia., bears S.76¼°W., 12.5 ft., with a healed double blaze.
Corner is located on a steep rocky N slope, N, 280 ft from an asphalt road, 10 ft wide, extending N.60°W. & S.85°E., & S, 50 ft from the N edge of timber, bears E & W, & S, 200 ft from the S edge of open field, bears E & W, with fir reproduction and brush in between.
