

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION NW Cor. Samuel Rich DLC #38

Alias	Description

Surveys of Donation Land Claims by - Dennis Hathorn, Deputy, dated Sept. 1856

At 46.63 chs. West of the NE. DLC cor.,
Marked a Fir 40" dia., for Witness to NW. cor., from which
A Maple 12" dia., bears North, 15 lks.
A Rock 15 x 30 ft. and 15 ft. high, bears South, 25 lks.

At 55.00 chs., NW cor. inaccessible from the E. or S.

South on W. bdy. of claim, at 5.40 chs.:
Marked a Maple 12" high for witness to NW. cor., from which
A Fir 36" dia., bears S.40°E., 36 lks.
A Maple 5" dia., bears S.80°W., 8 lks.

GLO retracement of Donation Land Claims, by George S. Pershin, under Special Instructions - Date of contract, July 25, 1896

The witness cor. for NW cor. of Claim 38 (on West bdy.)
The Fir is still standing 40" dia., S.40°E., 36 lks. dist.
mkd. Claim 38 BT. The Maples are both gone.
Set Fir post 4" sq., 4 ft. long, 24" in the ground for
witness cor. mkd. W. C. Cl. 38.

Wit. cor. for NW. Cor. of Claim 38 (On N. bdy.)
A Fir 40" dia., but dead as witness cor. The Maple is gone.
The rock 15 x 30 ft., 15 ft. high, South 25 lks. is still in
place. As the surface beyond this point is almost
impassible, I do not proceed farther.

Point for the orig. witness cor. for the NW. cor. of DLC #38,
at record dist; there is no remaining evidence of the
original corner, and is not remonumented.
(60.45 chs.)
Point selected for a witness point.
Set an iron post, 28" long, 2½" dia., 24" in the ground, with
brass cap mkd:

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from which
A Fir 33" dia., bears S.42½°E., 6 lks. dist. mkd. X BT.
A Fir 15" dia., bears S.68°W., 32 lks. dist. mkd. X BT.
(63.30 chs.)
True point for the NW. cor. of DLC #38.

From this point, the witness cor. for the NW. cor. of DLC #38, bears N.89°05'E., 8.37 chs. dist., monumented with the remains of the original corner tree, a decayed Fir stump 36" dia., no marks visible, from which the remains of the original corner accessories:

- A Maple root crown, bears North, 15 lks. dist.
- A sandstone boulder, 30 x 15 x 15 ft. above ground, bears South, 25 lks. dist., no marks visible.
