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GLO survey by Aurelius Todd, Deputy Surveyor, under Contract #629, dated April 24, 1894 - (DCSO records Vol. 5 Page(s) 1799-1800)

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I marked a stone in place 20x18x8 ins. above ground with cross (X) at exact cor. point with 3 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. for cor. to secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20, from which

- A Fir 4" dia., bears N.88°E., 50 lks. dist. mkd. T22S R10W S17 BT.
- A Cedar 6" dia., bears S.69°E., 40 lks. dist. mkd. T22S R10W S20 BT.
- A Cherry 4" dia., bears S.87°W., 30 lks. dist. mkd. T22S R10W S19 BT.
- A Fir 4" dia., bears N.1°W., 50 lks. dist. mkd. T22S R10W S18 BT.

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Orig. sandstone 20x18x8", now missing, falls in clear cut area, from which a:

- 4" Fir bears N.88°E., 50 lks.; now 30", face closed on E-W ridge top.
- 6" Cedar bears S.69°E., 40 lks.; missing, in 1964, prior to logging.

Jerry Phillip's found windfall stub with scribes S/S. (See affidavit in C.S. File 51/349)

- 4" Cherry bears S.87°W. 30 lks.; missing.
- 4" Fir bears N.1°W. 50 lks.; missing.

Spur ridge, course East, bears North 20 lks.; in place.

Set 1½" x 36" galv. Iron pipe with 3" bronze cap mkd: Ore. St. Bd. of Forestry T22S R10W S17 S18 S19 S20 1968 RS 359", 34" in ground, 2 ft. South of rock bluff 12 ft. high, course E-W, and from which a:

- 30" Fir, original, bears N.88°E., 33.0 ft., scribed RS 359
- 7" Fir, (on ridge top, course E. and 1 ft. East of above bluff, now running N-S) bears N.41°E., 12.7 ft.; scribed T22S R10W S17 BT.
- 14" Fir stump bears S.61°W., 28.6 ft. scribed T22S R10W S19 BT.
- 30" Fir stump bears S.9°E., 47.6 ft., scribed T22S R10W S20 BT.
- 7" X BO in above bluff, bears N.23°W., 2.0 ft.

Set 4" x 4" x 72" white painted cedar post 5 ft. S.42°W. of corner pipe.

OSBF metal location poster on 30" stump S.9°E. 47.6 ft.

Also BLM poster on 30" Fir, orig., N.88°E., 33.0 ft.
