An Alder 4" dia., which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. side for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. from which,

A Fir 4" dia., bears South 3 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.

A Fir 6" dia., bears N.15°E., 13 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.

Did not find original 4" Alder.

Found - 4" Fir bears South 3 lks.; now 13" x 9 ft. tall stub, in place, scribes $\frac{1}{4}$ S expose.

6" Fir bears N.15°E., 13 lks.; now 5" x 18" long rotted chunk, out of place, scribes BT remaining.

Set 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" galv. I.Pipe with 3" bronze cap mkd: "Oregon State Board of Forestry $\frac{1}{4}$ S17 S20 1973 RS 359", 35" in ground, and from which a:

New BTs -20" Fir bears S.42 $\frac{1}{4}$ °W., 12.0 ft. to face; scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S20 BT RS359.

34" Fir bears N.46 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 17.6 ft. to face; scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S17 BT.

Set 4" x 4" x 72" white painted cedar post 1.7 ft. East of corner pipe. OSBF metal location poster on 34" Fir BT, N.46 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 17.6 ft.
