Set 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" galv. Iron pipe with 3" bronze cap mkd: "Oregon State Board of Forestry  $\frac{1}{4}$  S16 1971 RS 359", 34" in ground, and from which a:

26" Fir bears N.25°W., 17.6 ft. to face; scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S17 BT

22" Fir bears N.69 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 14.3 ft. to face; scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S16 BT RS 359.

Set 4" x 4" x 72" white painted cedar post 2.0 ft. North of corner pipe.

22" Fir now 25", N.69 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 15.3 ft. (Rec. face 14.3 ft.) Both BTs with healed face.

New BT - 12" Maple S.25 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 50.1 ft. scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S16 BT. A 1968 tag reads N.28°W., 42 ft.
