A stone in place 14x15 ins., which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S. with cross (X) at exact cor. point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., from which
An Alder 6" dia., bears N.47°E., 25 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT
A Cedar 40" dia., bears S.85°E., 80 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT

BLM resurvey by James E. Jelley, Cadastral Surveyor - under Group #718, surveyed June/Aug 1970 - (DCSO records Vol. 36 Page(s) 14851)

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original BT:

A Cedar 80" dia., bears S.85°E., 80 lks., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28" long, 2 1/2" dia., 24" in the ground, with brass cap mkd:

from which a new bearing tree

A Fir 22" dia., bears N.14°E., 130 lks. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S26 BT.

BLM Dependent resurvey by Edith Forkner, Cadastral Surveyor, under Group #2750, surveyed April/May 2014 - (Plat T22-10-2016-1 all info on plat & DCSO records Vol. 58 Pgs 23319-20)

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2" dia, firmly set, with top flush with the surface of the ground, with a brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A decayed cedar snag, 75" dia, bears S.85°E., 52.8 ft., with no marks visible on open blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Jelley in 1970

A fir, 34" dia, bears N.14°E., 85.8 ft., with a healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

An alder, 13" dia, bears S.78 $\frac{1}{4}$ °E., 41.8 ft., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT on bark.

Drive an aluminum angle iron alongside the cor., which is located 20 ft. S. of a creek, 1 ft. wide, course W.
