Original post, now missing, from which a:
10" Myrtle bears N.2°E., 115 lks.; now 14" clump in place, no scribes visible.
50" Fir bears S.72°E., 235 lks.; now 32" x 5 ft. high rotted and burnt stub.
Closing cor. 31 & 32 bears S.88°55'E., 39.6 ft.; in place (The Elliott State Forest Survey Party of 1939 found this corner.)
Set 1½" x 36" Iron pipe with 3" bronze cap mkd: "Ore. St. Bd. of Forestry ¼ S6 1958 RS 359", 33" in ground, from which a:
13" Fir bears S.2°W., 78.7 ft. scribed ¼ S6 BT.
15" Fir bears S.30°W., 92.0 ft. scribed ¼ S6 BT RS 359.
Set 4"x4"x72" white painted cedar post 1.5 ft. SW of pipe.
OSBF metal poster on 32" Myrtle, N.46½°E., 26.5 ft.
