Orig. Homestead Entry Survey No. 213 - Entryman: Leonard Fletcher Wilson - H.E. No. 09836, dated Nov. 13, 1914 (DCSO records Vol. 28 Page(s) 12080)

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- Mon. Set- Sandstone, 28x24x5", 18" in the ground, over stone marked with cross for meander cor. and cor. No. 6 of this survey, marked 6 H E S 213 on side facing the claim and M C on side facing the river.
 - Bt's set- 14" dia. Spruce, bears N.59°15'E., 6 lks., mkd. X 6 H E S 213 M C B T.
10" dia. Ash, bears N.61°15'W., 205 lks., mkd. X 6 H E S 213 M C BT.
 - Dig pit, 36x36x18", 8' and raise a mound of earth 4' base, 2' high, 3¼' on line southwest of corner.

 - 14" now 36" dia. 15' high spruce snag with a previously opened unhealed rotted blaze property owner Alfred Ansama seen scribing in blaze in 1940, bears N.59¼°E., 4' (agrees with rec.) OBT.
 - 10" now clump of 3 13" dia. Young Ashes root crown, bears N.61¼°W., 135.3' (agrees with orig. BRG & DIST.)
 - 20"x12"x6" stone no marks found is found 2½' below ground west 20.5' (agrees with rec. to cor. #7)
 - Mon. set- 5/8"x 5' Iron rod with alum. cap stamped "No. 6 1997" protrudes 8" above ground.
5/8" I.R. HES Cor. #7, bears West 20.5' (8" below ground)
 - New Accessories -
 - 29" dia. Ash double blazed and scribed "X 6 HES 213 MC CS BT", bears N.64°W., 143.1'.
 - 9" dia. Holly bark, scribed "X BT", bears S.10½°W., 111.3'.
 - Power Pole "9-140", bears S.33°E., 148.7'
