A Fir 19" dia., bears S.16°E., 31 lks. dist. mkd. S5 T23S R12W BT.
A Fir 24" dia., bears N.2°W., 20 lks. dist. mkd. S32 T22S R12W BT.

Found - Stump of 19" Fir now 24", orig. BT, with marks, bears S.16°E., 20.1 ft.
Stump of orig. 24" Fir bears N.2°W., 11.2 ft. The bearing marks on this tree were cut off with the logs.
Set 3"x3"x4 ft. post for corner. Found old cedar stake here.

Survey by Warren D. Hootman - 1959 - C.S. File 58/37 and C.S. File 51/55

I find both witness trees are now stumps. The faces show no scribing but fit for size, distance and bearing. I place the corner point from these stumps.

Found - 2" ± Iron pipe (2¼" O.D.) firmly set 4" above ground. (I believe this monument to be set by Warren D. Hootman. See narrative filed in C.S. File 51/55 and C.S. File 58/37)

Orig. 19" now a 28" dia. Fir stump 4½ ft. tall with partially healed blaze and fragmentary scribing bears S.16°E., 20.5 ft.

Orig. 24" now a 33" dia. Fir stump with visible blaze and a scribed "S" with other fragmentary scribing bears N.2°W., 13.2 ft. This stump about 2 ft. tall.

Not of record, a 5/8" dia. I.P. bears S.63½°W., 3.8 ft.

New Accessories:

A 13" Cedar scribed "MC S5 DCSO BT" on a double blaze bears S.29°E., 23.2 ft.

A 28" Fir scribed "MC S33 CS BT" on a double blaze bears N.53½°E., 12.7 ft.
