A Myrtle 8" dia., bears N.11°E., 22 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT

The cherry tree cor. had fallen down. Set new post.

Myrtle 10" N.11°E., 22 lks. Old BT.

Fir 24" N.85°W., 45 lks.

This cor. is 60 lks. South of top of spur instead of canyon.

Found orig. 6" Cherry, missing, from which:

8" Myrtle bears N.11°E., 22 lks.; now 20" in clump of 9, inside honeycombed, axework visible.

Spur top bears North 60 lks.; in place.

Set 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" galv. I.Pipe with 3" bronze cap mkd. "Ore. St. Bd. of Forestry $\frac{1}{4}$ S26 S27 1969 RS 359", 34" in ground and from which:

18" Cedar bears S.62°E., 39.6 ft. to face, scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S26 BT RS 359.

30" Myrtle bears S.70°W., 51.9 ft. to face, scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S27 BT.

20" Myrtle, orig., bears N.11°E., 14.5 ft. to face, scribed BT.

Set 4x4x72" white painted cedar post 1.8 ft. N.57°W. of corner pipe.
