We mark bearing trees for corner as none were marked in 1961:  
New BTs- 12" D.Fir S.12°W., 52.0 ft. mkd. WP S28 CS BT.  
16" Myrtle S.26°E., 65.8 ft. mkd. WP S27 CS BT.

This corner lies on right bank of river approx. 85.0 ft. North of road, course E. and W.

Found - A 3¾" dia., brass cap (properly mkd) is set plumb. Protrudes 3" above silt-sand on right shore of Umpqua River. 1961 mound of stone is completely buried in sand (Cannot measure) 1961 orig. mon. No BTs were marked when monument was originally set in 1961.

1966 BTs- A 12" D.fir now a 28" dia., D.Fir with a fully healed double blaze; bears S.12°W., 52.0 ft. (as per record)

A 16" Myrtle now a 20" dia., Myrtle with a fully healed double blaze; bears S.26°E., 65.8 ft. (as per record)

New - Two symbols are scribed in rocks on Umpqua River's right shore:

An approximately 3½" dia., "O" near the high-point of 6 ft, by 6 ft, by 20 ft. long rock ledge bears

N.51¼°E., 33.6 ft.

Note - Monument is in narrow silt-sand flood plain on south shore (right bank) of the Umpqua River. Monument is subject to washout or burial in future flooding.
