Found - Laurel tree, now 20", growing out of old Laurel stump.
 Dead Fir snag, now 33", bark scribing "S 12 B", appears about 20 years old. Old scar below bark scribing facing corner - N.20°E., 15.2 ft. from Laurel.
 Tree to NW (N.30°W., 11.9 ft) uprooted & down, nearly all in Lake with "S" bark scribed on it.
 36" Fir N.40°W., 17.7 ft. with bark scribing "MC S12 T23S R10W BT" plainly visible, scribing about 20 yrs. old.
Blaze & scribe Laurel tree "MC S11/S12 CS" for corner.
Rescribe Fir snag to NE "MC S12 CS BT" in bark below old scar
No live trees near to East of Meander Corner.

Found - Corner tree & BTs as record in 1958 as follows:
 20" Laurel corner tree, alive & scribe "MC S12/11 CS" visible on unhealed blaze.
 36" Fir N.40°E. 17.7 ft. alive. Bark scribe visible.
 33" Fir snag, decaying, N.20°E., 15.2 ft., bark scribe visible below scar.
Set - 3/4" iron rod under corner tree.
 14" Laurel N.3°E., 4.6 ft. mkd: MC S12 CS BT.
Note - This corner lies near water's edge on steep, southerly slope.
