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GLO Survey by Henry L. Chandler, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract #619 dated June 5, 1893 - (DCSO records Vol. 7 Page(s) 2907)

Set a post, 4 ft. long, 4" sq. 24" in the ground, for cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14, & 15, marked T24S S11 on NE, R2W S14 on SE, S15 on SW, S10 on NW faces, with 4 notches on S & 2 notches on E edges; from which

 A yew, 8" dia. bears N.51°E., 48 lks. mkd: T24S R2W S11 BT

 A fir, 30" dia. bears S.20°E. 33 lks. mkd: T24S R2W S14 BT

 A hemlock, 14" dia., bears S.7°W., 68 lks., mkd: T24S R2W S15 BT.

 A maple, 5" dia., bears N.22°W., 23 lks., mkd: T24S R2W S10 BT.

Weyerhaeuser Co. - Aug. 1958 - C.S. File 53/110-22

Found - 8" Yew, now 12" N.51°E., 31.7 ft., scribing visible on upper face, lower face rotted.

 30" Fir, now 34" Fir snag S.23°E., 21.5 ft., scribing visible. (Rec. S.20°E., 21.5)

 14" Hemlock, now 16" S.5°W., 44.8 ft. (rec. S.7°W., 44.9) scribing visible.

 5" Maple, now 6" Vine Maple, N.22°W. 15.2 ft broken over at face, axe marks but scribing not visible

Set - 3" sq. Vine Maple post.

 50" Fir stump N.79°E., 4.7 ft., "W" nail & plate.

 40" Fir S.86°W., 41.8 ft., "W" nail & plate.

 "W" nail & plate added to 34" Fir & 14" Hemlock.

Found - Orig. 30" now 34" Fir sawed stump, mostly buried in log landing, S.20°E., 21.8 ft.

 No trace other Orig. BTs due to old logging.

 40" Fir down, S.86°W., approx. 42.0 ft., notch for "W" nail on under side, plate still attached.

Set - Brass cap at cor. mkd: County Surveyors T24S R2W
 (6' steel fence post Office S 10|S 11
 1.0' W of brass cap) 1969 S 15|S 14

New BTs- 50" D.Fir N.67°W. 60.0 ft. mkd: "T24S R2W S10 CS BT"

 40" D.Fir S.78°W. 86.6 ft. mkd: "T24S R2W S15 CS BT"

 No other trees available.

Note - This corner lies on log landing 60 ft. E of old growth timber, course N-S
