    40" cedar which in turn is 12" SE of a 36" cedar, is S.78°W., 22.5 ft. mkd: 1/4 S 16 CS BT.  
    12" Cedar N.23°E., 36.8 ft. mkd: 1/4 S 15 CS BT.

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Found - No trace of any orig. BTs in this area.  
    4"x4" scribed corner post, badly decayed.  
    40" now 42" Cedar, S.82°W., 22.5 ft., scribe visible on partially unhealed blaze.  
    NE BT destroyed by logging several years ago.  
Set - Brass cap at cor. mkd: County Surveyors T24S R3W Office, 1967 1/4 S 16|S 15  
New BTs- 12" D.Fir N.4°W., 10.6 ft. mkd: 1/4 S16 CS BT  
    12" Cedar S.89°E., 26.4 ft. mkd: 1/4 S15 CS BT  
Note - This corner lies on flat bench land & in timber left from thinning.

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Found - Rotted remains of scribed fir post.  
    40" now 42" Cedar (stump) bears S.83°W., (rec. S.78°W.) 24.0 ft. scribing visible (Rec. 22.5 ft)  
    NE BT destroyed by old logging.  
    1967 Brass cap at corner.  
    12" Cedar bears S.89°E., 26.4 ft. scribing visible BT tag, to center of tree.  
    12" now 14" D.Fir bears N.4°W., 10.6 ft. to center of tree scribing visible BT tag.  
New BTs- 18" D.Fir bears S.41°W., 22.1 ft. w/"W" nail & plate  
    48" Fir stump bears N.13°W. 74.0' w/"W" nail & plate
