Found - A 1 5/8" iron post by Baker in 1983 per M90-48, firmly set and projecting 10" above the ground, with a 2 1/2" brass cap (properly) marked.

From which BTs by Baker in 1983 -

- A 27" D.Fir bears N.4°30'E., 35.8 ft lightly burned (N.7°E., 35.1')
- A 27" D.Fir bears S.40°45'E., 24.4 ft lightly burned (S.39°E., 23.4')
- A 38" D.Fir bears N.48°30'W., 20.6 ft lightly burned (N.46½°W., 19.9')

New BT - A 17" D.Fir bears S.29°30'W., 54.4 ft marked "T24S R3W S22 BT" on double blaze
