File 67/41-3</p> <p>-----</p> <p>Found - 2½" dia., brass cap (properly mkd) on a 1" I.D. iron pipe protruding 10" above ground.</p> <p>An Oak 18" dia., now a rotted and fallen oak 16" dia., with a previously opened single blaze (no evidence of 1963 fd. scribing remains) The still intact center of root-crown of this tree bears N.70°E., 19.8 ft. (As per rec.) OBT</p> <p>An Oak 18" dia., now a 34" dia., W.Oak bears S.63°E., 117.2 ft. (As per 1963 rec.) This tree has evidence of a previously opened blaze, but the face and scribing seen in 1963 are rotted away. OBT</p> <p>An 11" W.Oak, now a fallen and partly rotted 15" dia., W.Oak with a fully healed double blaze the root-hole of which bears N.24°W., 5.0 ft. (As per rec) 1963</p> <p>A 10" W.Oak now a double trunk W.Oak the scribed trunk of which now shows a fully healed double blaze and is 11" in dia. The root-crown of the scribed trunk bears S.29°E., 19.5 ft. (as per rec) The center of now double trunk root-crown bears S.27¼°E., 20.1 ft. 1963 cont. next pg</p>

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New - A 13" dia., W.Oak scribed "INT L DLC 45 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears N.60½°E., 32.8 ft.
An 11" dia., D.Fir scribed "INT L DLC 45 CS" "BT" on a double blaze bears S.54°W., 19.1 ft.
A double trunk W.Oak the 13" dia., most southerly trunk of which is scribed "INT L DLC 45" "CS BT" on a double blaze. The center of the root-crown of the double trunk bears N.14°W., 19.6 ft.

Note - Monument is approx. 10 ft. south and 18 ft. west from a small stream flowing westerly. Monument is in a gently rolling stream bottom in an oak and fir woodland.
Compass decl. 15½°E.
