Found - 1963 2½" dia., brass cap (properly mkd) on a 1" I.D. iron pipe firmly set protruding 12" above ground.
 An oak 18" dia., now a large shallow root-hole with a fallen broken oak stump showing fragmentary scribing "S" and "W" bears N.16°E. 160.4 ft. 1856
 An oak 12" dia., now a shallow root-hole with no other clear evidence is near the record bearing and dist. N.6½°W., 159.1 ft. 1856
 A 14" oak, now a 23" dia., W.Oak with a fully healed double blaze; bears N.7½°E., 102.6 ft. (rec. N.9½°E., 102.6 ft.)1963
 An 11" W.Oak now a triple trunk W.Oak (grown together at root-crown) with the most southerly 15" dia., trunk showing a fully healed double blaze. The base of the scribed trunk bears N.66°E., 125.6 ft (rec. N.68°E., 125.6 ft) The center of the root crown of the now triple trunk tree bears N.65¼°E., 126.3 ft. 1963

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New - A 15" dia., pear which is not blazed or scribed
(only pear anywhere near corner) bears N.89°W.,
106.6 ft.
Rebuilt fence corner with fences running North,
South South east and west is ESE, 0.7 ft.
No suitable trees in SE and SW quadrants.

Note - Monument is on a gentle SE slope with pastureland to
the west and an oak and fir woodland to the east.
Compass decl. 15¼°E.
