Found - 11" Dia. x 5 ft tall fence post, leaning northerly, at the intersection of ancient East, West and North fence lines. This fence post very closely matches Thiel's record to the found NW BT and is accepted as the Vol. 1, PG. 66 corner.
BTs by Thiel in 1885 -
 A 10" dia. x 48" tall, sawed and partly rotted W.Oak stump bears N.35¾°W., 88.2 ft. with scribed marks "BT" and a chaining notch visible. (Rec. N.34½°W., 88.4 ft.)
 A distinct root hole bears S.12½°E., 109.6 ft.
New RM - A 5/8"x30" iron rod set 30" in the ground with a 1½" aluminum cap marked "DOUGLAS CO. SURVEYOR 2014" bears S.49°W., 2.0 FT.
New BTs- A 14" dia. D.Fir bears S.81°E., 11.7 ft. scribed "CS BT" on a low single blaze.
 A 15" dia. D.Fir bears N.15¼°W., 25.1 ft. scribed "CS" & "BT" on a double blaze.
Note - All BTs have BT tags attached. All new BTs have double blazed faces with bearings measured to the center of the tree at the root crown and distances measured to the side and center of the root crown unless otherwise noted.
 Corner falls on a gentle N-NW slope, 5.8 ft. North of a newer East-West fence line. The NE quadrant is mixed oak and fir forest and the NW, SE, & SW quadrants are open ground.
 Compass declination: 15¼°E.
