Found - Four-way fence corner found in small ravine and held for section corner.  
After tying in the NW and SE corners of section 25 I computed a position for the SW corner of section 19 per M 124-72.  
A traverse was then run in the vicinity of the south line of the SW ¼ of section 19, which tied in the south ¼ corner of section 19 and the M 134-14 monuments. At this time the four-way fence corner was found in a brushy draw. According to long time area residents this fence corner has been in place for decades, having been rebuilt in the same position more than once. The computed position is about 20 ft northerly. A review of the original 1851 GLO field notes revealed that this corner was set in a "ravine". No other draw or ravine lies anywhere near. The fence corner is therefore accepted as the SW corner of section 19 as shown.
