A Y.Oak 12" dia., bears N.17°W., 81 lks. dist.

A Y.Oak 14" dia., bears N.57°E., 89 lks. dist.

Found - Orig. 12" now 20" B.Oak snag N.17°W., 53.5 ft. I open and find good scribing "1/S".

I find stump hole that checks bearing and dist. for orig. NE BT.

New BTs -10" W.Oak bears N.26°E., 8.0 ft. scribed ¼ S21 CSBT

10" W.Oak bears S.48°W., 5.4 ft. scribed ¼ S20 CSBT

Corner lies N.50°E., 3.0 ft. from fence corner, fences running E. and W. and North.

Found - A 1959 2½" dia., brass cap (properly mkd) on a 1" I.D. iron pipe set protruding 10" above ground.

A Y.Oak 12" now an indistinct root-hole containing rotted oak roots bears N.17°W., 53.5 ft. (as per rec) OBT

No good evidence of NE OBT remains.

A 10" W.Oak now a 15" dia., W.Oak with a fully healed double blaze; bears N.21½°E., 8.0 ft. (Rec N.26°E., 8.0 ft - bearing to upper blaze center) 1959

A 10" W.Oak now an 11" dia., W.Oak with fully healed double blaze; bears S.48°W. 5.4 ft (per rec) 1959

Unrecorded BTs (probably marked 10-15 years ago):

A 12" dia. D.Fir with fully healed single blaze and old flagging tied to trunk; bears S.1½°E. 25.2 ft

A 13" dia. W.Oak with fully healed single blaze (opened to fd scribing "BT") bears N.49½°W. 39.1 ft

Note - Fence cor. as previously described also has fence running S.50°W. Monument is on moderately steep east slope in open woodland with fir, oak and some madrone. Compass decl. 15½°E.
