A Chinquapin 10" dia., bears N.62°W., 23 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S BT.

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Found - 28" D.Fir tree, N.85°E., 35.0 ft. Cut open and found good scribing "S".  
Chinquapin, down but stump in place, N.62°W., 15.2 ft. Shows good scar on bark but center completely rotted away. No scribing found.

25" W. Fir S.49°W. 15.0 ft. fully healed double blaze.  
UNRECORDED ACCESSORIES:  
14" D. Fir D.24°W. 22.0 ft. fully healed single blaze.  
21" Chinquapin N.55°E. 31.0 ft. Axe mark in bark. Small blaze scribed BT.  
Add 3½" mag nail to trees right side center.  
Steel posts, one is 0.7ft. North and the other is 2.0 ft South  
Notes - Mon. is approx. 210 ft. south of gravel road.  
Mon on gentle south slope, old reprod to west, younger reprod to east.
