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MS No 501, Olive Placer Claim, by Chas. M. Collier, US Deputy Mineral Surveyor, under instructions dated Oct. 20, 1902, Surveyed Oct./Nov. 1902 - (DCSO Records C.S. File 57/38)

A fir post 4½ ft. long 4" sq. set 18" in the ground with mound of stone around, scribed 1-501 whence

 A Fir 40" dia., bears North 6 ft.

 A Fir 18" dia., bears S.7½°W., 21 ft.

Each blazed and scribed 1-501 BT. Steamboat Creek bears East 40 ft. The US mineral monument No. 2 for Bohemia District bears S.8°8"W., 73.1 ft.

Cor. No. 1, Sur. No. 501, Olive Placer Claim, which is a fir post, 3" sq., extending 2½ ft. above a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, firmly set, marked 1-501 on S. side, from which a fir, 40" dia., bears N.10°W., 12 lks., marked 1-501 BT, and a fir, 16" dia., bears S.7½°W., 32 lks., with marks grown over, . bears S.57°53'E., 21.54 chs. from Sec. 23, 24, 25, & 26

Found - Rotted Remains of 4" square wood post, no marks remaining, near a small mound of stone.

 An orig 40" fir, now an 8 ft tall rotten snag bears north 6.0 ft., with scribing "BT" visible on wood fragments.

 An orig. 18" now 24" D.Fir bears S.7½°W., 21.0 ft., alive and well-healed.

At the corner point, we set a 1"x30" I.P 10" in the ground to the bedrock and supported in a mound of rock 3 ft. at the base and 1 ft. high, with

Note - This monument is set leaning to the west.
We mark a new bearing tree:

 A 14" D.Fir bears N.20°W., 15.4 ft., scribed "1 MS 501 CS BT" on a double blaze.

Note - This corner lies approx 40 ft. west of Steamboat Creek. Magnetic Declination 20°E.
