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Mineral Survey No. 501, Olive Placer Claim, by Chas. M. Collier, US Deputy Mineral Surveyor, under instructions dated Oct. 20, 1902, Surveyed Oct./Nov. 1902 - (DCSO Records C.S. File 57/38)

A post 4½ ft. long 4" sq. Set 18" in the ground scribed 5-501 whence

 A pine 12" dia., bears N.61°W., 13.6 ft.

 An Oak 12" dia., bears N.59½°E., 48 ft.

Each blazed and scribed 5-501 BT

Found - Orig. 12" now 14" W.Oak with previously opened upper blaze but no mark showing. We open lower blaze and find reverse scribe marks.

 The Original NW Tree, a 12" Pine is gone, however we find a scribed face, marked "6_501" lying on the ground near the true corner location.

 At the corner point located with reference to the orig. 12" now 14"W Oak bearing N.59½°E., 48.0 ft.

We set a 1"x 30" I.P. with brass cap attached, marked

We mark the following new BTs

 14" D.Fir bears S 28°E., 19.8 ft., scribed "5 MS 501 CS BT" on a double blaze.

 An 8" D.Fir bears N.86°E., 17.6ft. scribed "5 MS 501 CS BT" on a double blaze.

Note - This cor. lies on a steep south slope north of Steamboat Creek Forest Rd

 Magnetic Declination, 20° East.
