

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION 1/4 Cor. Secs. 26 & 27

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GLO Survey by Hezekiah H. Johnson, under Contract #721, dated May 1, 1900 (DCSO records Vol. 8 Page(s) 3520)  
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Set a fir post 3 ft. long, 3" sq., 24" in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., mkd ¼ S 27 on W., S 26 on E faces, from which  
A Fir, 15" dia., bears S.35°W., 8 lks. mkd ¼ S27 BT.  
A Hemlock, 18" dia., bears N.68°E., 35 lks., mkd ¼ S26 BT.

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Found - Orig. 15", now 26" Hemlock, recorded as fir, S35°W., 5.3 ft. prev. opened and shows "S" scribe. Alive  
Orig. 18", now 32" Hemlock N.68°E., 23.1 ft. alive, shows scar. Do not Open  
Set - Brass Cap at Cor. Mkd: County Surveyors Office 1966

New BTs- 10" Hemlock S.58°W., 10.8 ft. mkd. ¼ S27 CS BT.  
17" Hemlock N.29°E., 44.8 ft. mkd. ¼ S26 CS BT.  
Note - Corner lies on moderate, NE slope approx. 120 ft. S of old Jeep trail, course NE - SW on top of spur.

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Found - 1966 County brass cap properly marked, firmly set.  
Orig. 15" fir now 24" Hemlock snag 30 ft. high, with scribed "S" visible in previously opened blaze, bears S.25°W., 5.3 ft (Rec. S.35°W.)  
Orig. 18" now 30" Hemlock stump with good scar bears N.68°E., 23.1 ft.  
10" now 12" Hemlock, with "¼ S27 CS BT" visible in unhealed blaze bears S.56°W., 10.8 ft. (Rec. S.58°W.)  
17" now 22" Hemlock stump with "¼ S26 CS BT" visible in unhealed blaze bears N.29°E., 44.8 ft.  
New BTs- 7" Hemlock scribed "¼ S26 CS BT" in double blaze bears N.34°E., 42.3 ft.  
12" Hemlock scribed "¼ S26 CS BT" in double blaze bears S.56°E., 61.3 ft.  
20" Hemlock scribed "¼ S27 CS BT" in double blaze bears S.74°W., 77.2 ft.

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The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 26 & 27, perpetuated by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office in 1966, subsequently perpetuated by Quibell, in 1981, monumented with an iron post, 1¼" dia., firmly set, projecting 10" above ground, with a brass cap (properly) mkd.

A decayed hemlock stump, size indeterminate, bears N.68°E., 23.1 ft., with a hollow blaze.

A decayed fir stump, size indeterminate, bears S.35°W., 5.3 ft., with no marks visible.

A decayed hemlock stump, size indeterminate, bears N.26¼°E., 44.5 ft., with no marks visible.

A hemlock, 17" dia., bears S.52¾°W., 10.6 ft., with a healed double blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Quibell

A hemlock, 12" dia., bears N.32¾°E., 42.4 ft., with a healed double blaze.

A hemlock, 13" dia., bears S.57¾°E., 61.0 ft., with a healed double blaze.

A hemlock, 25" dia., bears S.72½°W., 77.1 ft., with a healed double blaze.

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Found - 2½" DCSO brass cap on 1" ID iron pipe, up 12". 1966  
Burned-dead 21" hemlock S.54°W., 10.5 ft. (rec. S.52¾°W., 10.5) add 3½" PK right side center healed double blaze. 1966

Large root hole N.32¾°E., 42.4 ft. 1981

Burned-dead 13" hemlock S.57¾°E., 60.4 ft. (Rec. 61.0 ft) fully healed double blaze. Add 3½" PK right side center. 1981

26" D.Fir S.72½°W., 77.1 ft. fully healed double blaze. Add 3½" PK nail, right side center.

New - Burned-dead 22" double trunk Hemlock S.22°E., 12.0 ft. 3½" PK nail, right side center. Not blazed or scribed.
