Orig. BT, a 11" now 28" dia. 50 ft. high W.Fir snag, we opened & found scribing "BT" bears S.72½°E., 34.3 ft.(agrees well with 1962 BLM rec.; orig. rec. S.68°E., 31.7 ft.)

30" now 42" dia. 2 ft. high D.Fir stump with evidence of a partial lower blaze no scribing found., bears N.55°W., 83.5 ft. (agrees with orig. brg, dist. agrees with 1962 BLM resurvey, Orig. Rec. N.55°W., 84.5 ft.)

1962 BT, a 15" now 24" dia. ½ ft. high D.Fir stump with a fully healed lower blaze, bears N.15°W., 33.0 ft. (agrees with record)

New BTs- A double trunked O. Ash, double blazed and scribed on 11" North trunk "¼ S29 CS BT" bears S.3°E., 14.5 ft.

10" dia. R. Cedar double blazed & scribed "¼ S30 CS BT" bears N.11°W., 34.9 ft.

10" dia. Maple double blazed and scribed "¼ S30 CS BT" bears S.89°W., 13.6 ft.

Corner lies at North edge flat valley bottom.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 29 & 30, monumented with an iron post, 2½" dia., firmly set flush with the ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd. from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A white fir snag, 28" dia., bears S.72½°E., 52 lks., with scribe marks BT visible on opened blaze.

A fir stump, 42" dia., bears N.56¼°W., 126½ lks., with healed blaze.

and the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by Brooks

A fir stump, 15" dia., bears N.15°W., 50 lks., with healed blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Smith & Flause, in 1986

An ash, 13" dia., bears S.5°E., 21 lks., with scribe marks ¼ S29 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

A maple, 11" dia., bears S.88°W., 21 lks., with scribe marks S30 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

A cedar, 12" dia., bears N.10°W., 54 lks., with scribe marks S30 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.
