Set basalt stone 14x8x8", 10" in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ on N face, from which
A hemlock, 10" dia., bears N.14°E., 27 lks., mkd: ¼ S5 BT.
A yew, 20" dia., bears S.40°E., 36 lks., mkd: ¼ S8 BT.

BLM dependent resurvey Levi E Tallett, Cadastral Engineer (1951) and C. Albert White, Cadastral Surveyor (1963), under Group # 294, surveyed May 1951 - Aug 1963 - (DCSO records Vol. 32 Page(s) 13353-4)

The ¼ sec. cor of secs. 5 & 8, monumented with a broken basalt stone, 14x8x8", firmly set, marked ¼ on N. face, from which the original bearing trees:

A hemlock, 16" dia., bears N.13°45'E., 29 lks., scribe marks S5 BT visible. (Rec bears N.14°E., 27 lks.)
A yew, 24" dia., bears S.41°E., 37 lks., blaze rotted, partial scribe marks visible. (Record: bears S.40°E., 36 lks.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 36" long, 1" dia., 28" in the ground, with brass cap mkd,

from which

A hemlock, 14 ins. diam., bears S.52°E., 62 lks., mkd. S8 BT.
Bury the orig. corner stone alongside the iron post.

BLM Dependent resurvey by Richard J. Dieckmann, Cadastral Surveyor, under Group No. 2749 , surveyed Aug. 2014/April 2015 - (DCSO records Vol. 58 Page(s) 23345-6)

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 & 8, monumented with an iron post, 1" dia., firmly set, projecting 11" above the ground with a brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A hemlock snag, 17" dia., bears N.13¾°E., 19.1 ft., with illegible scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.
A yew, 23" dia., bears S.41°E., 24.4 ft., with no marks visible on an opened blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A red cedar, 23" dia., bears N.28½°E., 15.8 ft., mkd. ¼ S5 BT.
