Set basalt stone 14x10x5", 10" in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ on N face, from which

An Arbutus, 14" dia., bears N.33°E., 30 lks., mkd: ¼ S4 BT

An Arbutus, 16" dia., bears S.43°W., 30 lks., mkd: ¼ S9 BT

BLM dependent resurvey Levi E Tallett, Cadastral Engineer (1951) and C. Albert White, Cadastral Surveyor (1963), under Group # 294, surveyed May 1951 - Aug 1963 - (DCSO records Vol. 32 Page(s) 13350-1)

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 4 & 9, monumented with a basalt stone, 12x10x6" firmly set, marked ¼ on N. face, from which the original bearing trees:

A madrone, 14" dia., bears N.34°E., 28 lks., blaze healed. (Record: bears N.33°E., 30 lks.)

A madrone, 14" dia., bears S.39°W., 30 lks., blaze rotted, partial scribe marks visible. (Rec bearing, S.43° W.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 36" long, 1" dia., 28" in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A sugar pine, 7" dia., bears N.4½°W., 8 lks., mkd: ¼ S4 BT

A sugar pine, 14" dia. bears S.38°E. 35 lks. mkd: T25S R2W S9 BT.

Bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post.

BLM Dependent resurvey by Richard J. Dieckmann, Cadastral Surveyor, under Group No. 2749 , surveyed Aug. 2014/April 2015 - (DCSO records Vol. 58 Page(s) 23342)

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 4 & 9, monumented with an iron post, 1" dia., firmly set, projecting 6" above the ground, with a brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A decayed madrone stump, size indeterminate, bears N.34°E., 18.5 ft., with no marks visible.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Tallett and White in 1951-63

A sugar pine, 31" dia., bears S.38°E., 23.1 ft., with a healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

An incense cedar, 7" dia., bears N.14¾°E., 11.6 ft., mkd. 1/4 S4 BT.
