A chinquapin, 6" dia. bears S.57°E., 26 lks. mkd: ¼ S14 BT</p>

Recently chopped open to show plain scribing "¼". 6" Chinquapin, now 10" Alive, S.57°E. 17.2 ft. The scars on this tree have never grown over & faint traces of old scribing can be seen. At Corner Point find square hole in dirt a few inches below surface. Set Iron Pipe with Brass Cap Mkd: "County Surveyor's Office, 1958 T25S R2W S15/S14. Blaze & Scribe: 5" Hemlock S.45°E. 11.5 ft. "¼ S14 CS BT". Note: Pipe set by Irving by Prop. dist, for this ¼ Corner bears S.59°W. 111.5 ft. (Fd 1" Pipe 5" above ground. Both trees alive and in good condition.)</p>
