The ¼ sec. cor., which is a Myrtle tree, badly decayed, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I reestablish as follows:

Destroy old ¼ sec. cor. and at the exact point, I set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 3" sq., 24" in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. mkd. ¼ S32 on N. and 5 on S. face, from which
A Cedar 10" dia., bears S.83°E., 25 lks. mkd. ¼ S5 BT.
A Hemlock 10" dia., bears N.20°E., 10 lks. mkd. ¼ S32 BT.

Found - Orig. 18" now 25" Fir, alive, N.10°W., 5.3 ft. bark scribe visible in fair condition "¼ BT". (1881 BT

Found - 38" Fir stump, 1968 BT, BLM tag, bears; S.01°W., 27.1 ft to center.

New BTs- 12" Fir, scribed "S32 ¼ BT" BT tag, bears; N.57°18'E., 14.9 ft to spike.

10" Fir, scribed "S32 ¼ BT" BT tag, bears;

N.85°23'E., 12.9 ft to spike.
