A fir, 65" dia., bears S.79½°E. 92 lks., with healed blaze and bearing trees mkd. by Tracy
A hemlock, 9" dia. bears N.81°E. 80 lks. with healed blaze
A hemlock 10" dia. bears S.48°E. 74 lks. with healed blaze and a bearing tree of which I have no record
A fir, 56" dia., bears N.41°W., 104 lks. with healed blaze
