Found - 2½" DCS0 brass cap, proj 8" (properly mkd)
Sawn, singed, 17"x 2' hemlock stump, S.34°W., 24.1 ft., blaze scar, face inside. Add 3½" mag nail top center.
New - 13"x 1½' Hemlock stump N.32°E., 13.0 ft.
18"x 1½' Hemlock stump N.87°E., 24.0 ft.
36"x 3 ft. Hemlock stump N.78°W., 12.5 ft.
All 3 stumps have 3½" mag nails set top center (B&D to mag nail = C.R.C.)
Note - Compass decl. 14¼°E.
Mon is approx 85' south of gravel road.
