Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1" dia., 27" in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A hemlock, 10" dia., bears S.20°E., 14 lks., mkd: 1/4 S18 BT
A fir, 9" dia., bears N.40°W., 45 lks., mkd: 1/4 S7 BT.

Found - 1928 GLO Brass Cap, property marked.
Orig. 10" Hemlock, alive, S.5°E. (Rec. S.20°E.) 9.2 ft., shows good scar.
Orig. NW BT gone due to R/W falling.

We move Brass Cap 30.0 ft. due west & Reset for witness corner and add marks: "W C 30 ft. E. to Cor.
New BTs- 30" Cedar S.21°E., 36.6 mkd: "WC 1/4 S 18 CS BT".
48" D. Fir N.68°E., 9.9 ft. mkd: "WC 1/4 S 7 CS BT".

Remaining Orig. BT should not be removed by road construction
Orig. 15" Hemlock bears S.72 1/2°E., 32.3 ft. from WC.

Note - The bearing not agreeing with the record and other BT, if there was buried under numerous logs. Existing BT faced the location of Brass Cap which appeared not to have been moved. Also, the forest service apparently accepted this location.

Found - 1928 GLO Brass cap properly marked as per original notes and 1969 renewal. Cap is tilting due to the up-rooting of the County Surveys NE BT.
32" cedar alive and in good condition.
Cedar bears S.21°E., 36.6 ft. and scribed WC 1/4 S18 CS BT. Scribing visible on blaze.
Orig. 10" now 15" Hemlock BT uprooted.
48" D. fir marked by County Surveyor uprooted. Scribe visible on unhealed blaze, W C 1/4 S7/S18 T26S R1E

New BTs- 26" D. Fir bears S.42 1/2°W. 26.4 ft mkd WC 1/4 S18 CS BT
Corner lies approx. 35' west of forest service road # 2688.
Compass declination: 20°East
