A Fir 8" dia. for 1/4 sec. cor. on S. bdy. of sec. 35, I mark 1/4 S35 on N. side, from which
A Hemlock 10" dia., bears N.46°E., 21 lks. mkd. 1/4 S35 BT.
A Fir 24" dia., bears N.50°W., 20 lks. dist. mkd. 1/4 S35 BT

Found - No trace of Corner tree, due to logging.
10" Hemlock now burnt stump, N.46°E., 13.7 ft., scribe visible.
24" Fir N.50°W., 12.3 ft high stump, shows good scar

New BT - 55" D.Fir N.82½°W., 189.3 ft. mkd. "1/4 S35 CS BT"
This corner lies 70 ft. East of 1/4 cor. sec. 2, T27-1W.

FD. BC & 2 BTs by Quimby & Ware, Aug. 1980 M79-55: Set post & sign 2/5 ft. south.

Found - A 1 1/4" iron post, firmly set, projecting 9" above the ground with a 2 1/2" dia. brass cap
(Note: The monument for the north 1/4 corner Section 2, T27S, R1W, W.M. bears S.88°W., 70.0 ft.)

From which the original bearing trees:

Was 24" now 18"x8 ft. tall, broken, buckskin fir snag bears N.50°W., 13.3 ft. with no evidence of scar or face (Rec. N.50°W., 20 lks.)

Was 55" now 63" D. Fir bears N.82°30'W., 189.3 ft. with a healed face (Rec. N.82°30'W., 189.3 ft.).

New BT - A 13" D.Fir bears N.16°W., 15.8 ft. which I scribe "1/4 S35 BT" on a double face.

All new BTs have double blazed faces with a brass washer stamped "PLS 1941" nailed into the lower blaze. Bearings are taken to the center of the tree at the root crown & dists. are measured to an alum nail in the root crown at the side and center of the tree. All BTs have a 6" red band painted around the tree & the blazed face painted red and BT & USFS Land Survey Monument sign nailed to the tree.
